NLP empowers students — and the public — with the skills and habits of mind needed to be smart, active consumers of news and information and equal and engaged participants in a democracy.

Founded in 2008, NLP is the leading provider of news literacy education, and as the only organization that focuses solely on news literacy education, is *the* place that educators and education leaders turn to. NLP works with thousands of educators in all 50 states and more than 100 other countries. We value educators and district leaders as equal partners in our mission, working on the frontlines in the fight against misinformation.

# **Free District Partnership**

Because school districts are integral to the fight against misinformation, we are committed to developing district partnerships that have meaningful impact. We'll provide you with support to implement all our resources and programs, including our signature e-learning platform **Checkology® virtual classroom**.



## What We Ask of You

- School districts formally endorse and promote Checkology and NLP educator resources and programs.
- Checkology is used in at least two schools with at least two active educators per school.
- Partners agree to a minimum two-year commitment.

Partnering districts also agree to at least one of the following for each of the two years of the commitment.

Educators participate in a NewsLitCamp®.

The district participates in at least one paid professional learning session.

The district agrees to **policy work** to embed news literacy into its graduation requirements.

Educators participate in an **NLP learning event** at no cost to the district.

# What We Provide to You

- NLP's expansion team works with district leaders to determine an implementation strategy to meet the district's goals and standards alignment.
- Partnering districts receive Checkology administrator accounts, which allow designated staff members to collect data to demonstrate learning and mastery of aligned Checkology lessons.
- The expansion team provides free professional learning to partnering districts.
- Through the Newsroom to Classroom program, registered educators have access to a directory of vetted journalists who can visit your classroom, virtually or in-person, and speak with your students on the issues that matter most to your community.
- All partnering districts receive data reports in October, January and at the end of the school year.

Checkology also helps users understand the role of the free press and the First Amendment in our democracy. Registered educators have access to a directory of vetted journalists in the **Newsroom to Classroom** program who can speak with your students, virtually or in-person, on the issues that matter most to your community.
