Artificial intelligence tools are capable of creating visuals that may appear authentic at first glance. Here are some tips to identify these realistic-looking fakes.	
Investigate the details of the claim. This post claims that the video was taken "last night" in Norway, but can those claims be verified? Try using those details in a web search to uncrover additional context.	

Look at the social media post again, keeping "The Takeaway" in mind. Do you notice anything now that you didn't the first time? Why do you think some people believed this rumor?

4. "The Five Factors"

Challenge! Without looking at "The 5 Factors" in the entry, can you figure out which of NLP's five factors apply to this example? Put a check mark next to the factors that you think reflect why this example isn't true and explain your choices in the boxes below. Remember, only some of these factors apply to most examples.
